

UF Online Ranked #5 in the US

UF Online was recently ranked #5 in the nation and #1 in Florida for its online undergraduate programs by U.S. News and World Report. About Our Campus

Gainesville is home to the University of Florida, and is consistently ranked as one of the friendliest cities and best college towns in America. Gainesville maintains 37 active parks, more than 60 miles of on-street bike lanes, and opportunities to fish, snorkel, surf, hike, and camp are just a short drive away. You can enjoy hiking amongst some 20 distinct biological communities and more than 270 species of birds at Payne's Prairie. Housing

Student Self-Reported Academic Record (SSAR)

The Student Self-Reported Academic Record (SSAR) must be submitted and linked to your freshman application by December 1st. The SSAR is UF's self-reported transcript. It is an online form in which students enter their high school courses, dual enrollment courses, and 9th–11th year grades. Students also list senior year courses in progress.



FAQ: If a dual enrollment class fulfills a full year of high school credit, students should enter the grade twice (first semester and second semester)

Once a student submits the UF application, please allow 72 hours for the application to process. Students should then log on to our website and click "Check Application Status". Students should then click the "Freshman" box pictured above. All freshmen applying to UF must submit and link the SSAR, including those who have already graduated. Financial Aid

To apply for financial aid at UF, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov. Students can file a 2017-18 FAFSA as early as October 1, 2016. UF's "On-Time" deadline to receive the results of your 2017-18 FAFSA from the federal processor is December 15, 2016. Apply well before December 15 to ensure that the federal processor has time to analyze and send the results of your FAFSA to UF. Financial aid is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis so apply as early as possible to be considered for the most, and best aid. In order for UF to consider students for a financial aid package, they must be an admitted student and have met the "On-Time" deadline. What can students do to prepare for the 2017-18 FAFSA?

Use Your FSA ID

Create an FSA ID at https://fsaid.ed.gov. An FSA ID gives you access to Federal Student Aid's online systems and can serve as your legal signature. You must have an FSA ID before you can file a FAFSA.

Apply Online

SFA recommends filing online using the FAFSA website. Filing an online FAFSA can save you weeks of processing time. The online application also has edit checks to catch errors. The online application is available at www.fafsa.gov.

Apply Early

Apply starting October 1, 2016. For your application to be considered "On-Time," SFA must receive your FAFSA results, with a calculated Expected Family Contribution (or EFC), by December 15, 2016. Keep in mind that you are submitting your FAFSA to the federal government, not to the University of Florida. Submit your FAFSA weeks before the December 15 deadline so that there is enough time for your FAFSA data to reach our office before the deadline. Apply as early as possible to be considered for the most, and best aid.

Use the IRS DRT

The 2017-18 FAFSA will use 2015 income and tax information for students and parents. Use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT) when possible to automatically import your tax information into your FAFSA.

Use UF's Federal School Code

List the University of Florida and the UF Federal School Code (001535) as a school choice on the FAFSA.

Center for Precollegiate Education and Training

JSEHS brings talented students and their teachers together to engage with UF faculty and graduate students, to present student-conducted research in science and humanities fields, and to explore creativity in the sciences at a top research institution.
